

Finances this past year have improved considerably, compared to previous years, as our funding calculation was reassessed. I am Dennis Jackson and I have been a Steward and a Health and Safety rep for 23 years and so far It's been another busy year going though Health and Safety policies and going on Health and Safety site visits. these things are an ongoing and have to be done on a regular basis, new starters might not know about or understand the dangers of the work that they are carrying out, and old hands might slip in to bad habits.

There have been some very serious incidents this year, most people don't even know they have taken place. A collision between a refuse vehicle and a bus, and people being hit by cars. I went to Keele University in September, I think it is always a good idea to stay up to date with any changes in Health and Safety law and to improve my own knowledge of Health and Safety.

I went to a few very good fringe meetings while I was there, one of them was on suicide, men are 3 times more likely to commit suicide than women. So guys if you need help reach out it is not a sign of weakness. I have been a Health and Safety rep for more than. Covid is on the increase again so I urge everyone who can to get their covid jab. One of my colleagues and myself have been helping to put together an equities charter called the uncomfortable conversation.

I am also pleased that I was the delegate for the Disability Conference this year as well.
